Indications: For allergic reactions, hay fever, hives, and itching.

Table Notes:

- Age Limit:
 - For allergies, don't use under 1 year of age (Reason: it's a sedative).
 - Exception: Serious allergic reactions or widespread hives. For these cases, infants 6-12 months of age may have ½ tsp or 2.5 mL of liquid Benadryl (12.5 mg/5 mL) every 8 hours for 2 doses. If weight over 20 lb, use the dosage chart.
 - For colds, not recommended (Reason: no proven benefits). Exception: Recommended by your child's doctor.
 - Avoid multi-ingredient products in children (Reason: FDA recommendations 10/2008).
- **Dosage:** Determine by finding child's **weight** in the top row of the dosage table.
- Measuring the Dosage: Use a special measuring or dosing device. If possible, use the syringe or dropper that comes with the medicine. If not, medicine syringes are available at pharmacies. If you use a teaspoon, it must be a measuring spoon. Regular household spoons are not accurate. Also, remember that 1 level teaspoon eguals 5 mL and that ½ teaspoon eguals 2.5 mL.
- Frequency: Repeat every 6-8 hours as needed.

- · Adult Dosage: 50 mg.
- Children's Benadryl Fastmelts: Each Fastmelt tablet contains the equivalent of 12.5 mg of diphenhydramine HCL and dosed the same as chewable tablets.
- Concentration: Dosage charts are for U.S. products only. Concentrations may vary with international pharmaceuticals. Always double-check the concentration if product bought from outside the U.S.
- Calculating Dosage: 0.5 mg/lb/dose (1 mg/kg/dose).
 Do not recommend dosages above the OTC adult dosage listed above.
